Brockton Neighborhood Health Center

The Brockton Neighborhood Health Center was in a big jam. Their 6-year old, 10BaseTx + T1 radio link had failed, and they had no backup for their telecommunications. FastLinks was made aware of their problem at 3pm on a Thursday, and by 11am the following day we had their communications restored. What made this a bit challenging was that the failed radios were discontinued and the customer wanted to use as much of their existing infrastructure (mounts, antennas, & cabling) as possible. In short order, FastLinks was able to identify a suitable replacement radio system that was in-stock and could be delivered the next morning. FastLinks not only restored the communication channels in a timely fashion, but upgraded the capacity of the Ethernet channel from 10Mbps to 16Mbps. All for less than \$6,000.
